Christians need to give as an expression of their love for God and their fellow men. When we give in this way He promises to bless us!

THANKS BE TO GOD FOR HIS INDESCRIBABLE GIFT! (2 Cor. 9 :19)

It is as we receive God's gift of salvation in Christ, and His indwelling Spirit, that He is able to transform our attitude to giving. Should nobody suitable be found from within the Diocese, then the position will be advertised nationally. This will, obviously delay the appointment, but cannot happen before an internal appointment has been explored.

<u>'HATS' IN THE BELFRY</u> THE FOLLOW UP

Once again, several members of the bell ringing team, and one 'partner', recently spent a busy Saturday morning in the bell chamber, continuing the cleaning and painting process to ensure the bells are in pristine condition for the Quinquennial Inspection.

Following a visit by Ian Smith of the Devonshire Guild of Bellringers, we had been advised to carry out various remedial actions to ensure the continued safety of the bells, and as a result of this we would like particularly to thank Francis Lancelles for replacing the metal strap on Bell No 5 stay, Frank from Acorn Saddlery, South Molton, for providing saddle felt to retain oil in the bell mechanism bearings, and Bob Ogden for supplying a huge bar of beeswax to lubricate the bell sliders - all without charge. Without this help and, of course, the invaluable time of the 'workers', it would be almost impossible to keep the belfry in good working condition, and the bells ringing out over the countryside. We would like to add at this point that lan Smith commented that the plain bearings used in the Cruwys Morchard bells are normally expected to last for 80 to 90 years, but owing to the excellent standard of maintenance throughout the years, our 104 year old bearings are still in relatively good order and the bells safe for ringing.

We also must not forget to thank BAM Construction Ltd. for again loaning hard hats for those who wanted them, and Nellie and Hilary for providing our mid morning snack.

us. We have really enjoyed these times together!

Our study of the Creed has shown how all the statements that we make when we recite the words of the Creeds together at our Church services, are actually derived from the Bible, and are a summary of what we believe as Christians. So we have looked at the relevant passages in the Bible, and found out why we say what we say, and what impact it should have on our daily lives.

In December we shall start a new series of studies in the first 8 chapters of Mark's Gospel, entitled "The Coming King". Who was Jesus? Was He / is He really a King? Or <u>the</u> King? If so, why did he come in such a humble and secret way? Why is He so powerful, yet opposed? Why do some recognise Him, but not others? What difference does He make to my life?
