CELEBRATING SIXTY YEARS OF FAITHFULNESS

Whether we are fervent royalists or frustrated republicans, we must all surely admire the great faithfulness that the Queen has demonstrated over her six decades of public service. She has experienced difficult times in the life of our nation, as well as within her own family, and yet she has persevered in fulfilling the unique role to which she was appointed.

This level of consistent commitment is highly unusual. We seem to have become a nation of quitters. If a job is too challenging, we abandon it. If a marriage goes through tough times, we give up on it. If doing the right thing is demanding, we do the wrong thing instead. Our national motto has become: 'If at first you don't succeed...give up'.

So what is it that has allowed the Queen to remain faithful to her calling? No doubt the constant support of

her husband has been a great help, but her clear Christian faith appears to be the bedrock upon which her long reign has been built.

As Her Majesty once revealed:

"For me the teachings of Christ and my own personal accountability before God provide a framework in which I try to lead my life. I have drawn great comfort in difficult times from Christ's words and example".

Her faithfulness is rooted in the faithfulness of Jesus Christ. And the good news that Christ's teaching brings us is the promise of forgiveness for our lack of faith. The Queen emphasised this in her most recent Christmas message:

"God sent into the world a unique person - neither a philosopher nor a general, important though

they are, but a Saviour, with the power to forgive. Forgiveness lies at the heart of the Christian faith. It can heal broken families, it can restore friendships and it can reconcile divided communities. It is in forgiveness that we feel the power of God's love".

The tasks that God calls us to fulfil may be very modest when compared to the Queen's many years of service, and yet we can all learn from her example of faithfulness, inspired by commitment to Jesus Christ. And we all need to claim that promise of forgiveness for the times when we have abandoned our responsibilities and ignored God's call on our lives.

"If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness." (1 John 1v9)

In fact it is rather an in between time, the spring flowers of Cow Parsley, Bluebells and hedge Garlic are a memory, and we await the Willow Herb and Hogweed. This is the time of climbers like Dog Roses, Honeysuckle and Travellers' Joy, and Shrubs such as Guelder Rose, and now is the time to pick Elderflowers to make that delicious Cordial. Now you will see

Poppies in the fields which have not been heavily fertilised, and the large Ox-eye Daisies in the hedgerows, and Meadowsweet is coming out in the damper places. It would seem to be a domination of white flowers.

Some of the Butterflies are starting to emerge, Meadow Brown, Tortoiseshells

and Common Blue, to mention the more common ones

The migrant birds have now settled, and are busy nesting and feeding their young. The resident birds may be coping with their second brood. They are all far too busy tending their young, so there is no time for them to sing; anyway they have



found their mate and have their own territories. The little birds are often in the tree-tops feeding on aphids caterpillars there; they are very acrobatic and fun to watch, but difficult to identify. The Blackbirds are digging for worms, if the ground is not too hard, and then the larger birds are feeding their young on the results of raids on other smaller birds' nests

For the walk for the month, I would suggest a day on one of the local moors. Dartmoor, Exmoor or Molland Moor, but take your map and make sure you know where you are going and follow the footpath. Most are well marked.

DISCOVER BELL RINGING

n appeal to all in the Exe Valley Mission Community, and anyone else interested.

Bell ringing is an ancient art, over 400 years old, and there are over 4,000 churches in the UK with bells hung for ringing. Once gained, bell ringing is a skill for life you will never forget, and it can open up a lifetime of experiences and enjoyment. Learning to ring is all about technique - much more than it is about strength or mathematical ability.

Learn to ring and you will find an enormous number of opportunities open to you, both social and in visiting churches in other localities. Bell ringing is obviously part of a church and its services - the half hour call to a service is one of the pleasant sounds on a Sunday. Bells are rung for weddings and occasionally funerals, and other celebrations. As a ringer, you are welcomed as a visitor in other towers.

The Stoodleigh bells have recently been re-hung in a new frame and are a light peal, the tenor (heaviest) just 7cwt. Age is no limit (although height could be a problem with very young children, but at the upper end my brother, for example, learned when he was over 60!). Lapsed experienced ringers, ringers, especially those interested in learning you are all very welcome.

So.... come to Stoodleigh on Thursday 12th July at 7pm and find out more. You will be able to watch the bells being rung, go up the tower to see them and have a go at ringing.





FAIRTRADE AND GLOBAL WARMING

We are constantly being reminded that Climate change is real. Its effects are already being felt and these will continue to increase exponentially should the current status quo remain. As the world powers wrestle over commitments to decrease emissions, climate change continues to impact people's lives. Unfortunately, when the elephants fight, it is the grass which suffers, in this case, natural resource dependent communities such as Fairtrade farmers. They form part of the population which is being affected by climate change either directly or indirectly.

Most Fairtrade farmers depend on farming as their sole source of livelihood. Any disruption of the farming system represents a direct threat to the livelihood of those still vulnerable to poverty.

While the producers who participate in Fair Trade schemes have done very little to cause climate change, they will be among the most affected. Many of them are located in geographic regions where climate change is likely to be severe, they are engaged in agricultural activities which are likely to be highly affected, and their poverty reduces their capacity to respond. Producers in different areas will need to adapt to the effects of climate change in different ways (some more expensive and drastic than others). If producers fail to adapt to climate change they risk losing their sources of livelihood which directly translates into an issues of social justice.

Fairtrade producers are also increasingly being put under pressure to reduce the amount of carbon that they emit. This process is widely referred to as mitigation.

Some of these strategies measures to mitigate against climate change may mean decreased trade especially for producers who are unable to reduce the amount of carbon that they emit in the production process. In some cases, importing countries will now count the carbons that a product produces and will settle for the least carbon emitting products.

Climate change and the policies at national and global level are set to have an impact on Fairtrade producers and ultimately the availability of such products on your shelves. Hence it is important that Fairtrade supporters add their voice to climate change talks.

FEEDING OUR FUTURE

As many of us have noticed, the planet in general and the human species in particular are facing some extreme challenges at this time. World energy prices continue to rise significantly, the impacts of global warming are worsening and the international economy sits on a knife edge.

The consequences of these three interconnected crises are nowhere more obvious than the effects on what and how we eat. Declining oil supplies mean more expense to sustain industrial agriculture, fuelled more so by growing demands from countries such as China, Brazil and India. This also means dearer transport costs and potential disruption to supplies. The farther our food travels, the more it will be at risk. Instability in the markets and commodity speculation are all adding to the situation.

The message is clear: our food will cost us all much more in the future and we are unhealthily over-dependent on supply chains that are not secure or sustainable.

It is obvious that food is fundamental to life. Less obvious perhaps is the faith perspective that Christians are obliged in their discipleship to share the Earth's resources fairly and to stand in solidarity with those who hunger. The Communion or Eucharist itself expresses an economy of participation in which God has no favourites, and all are fed and no-one goes hungry. What a contrast to the greed culture which hoards luxury foodstuffs for the benefit of the wealthy!

But there are signs of hope - examples of sharing rather than competing. One such sign is the increasing number of community food projects to be found in Devon. These include garden-share schemes, community farms, orchards, allotments, grow-share initiatives, food waste re-cycling, neighbourhood markets. produceconsumer links, food cooperatives and community shops. All of these are helping local people to resource and re-skill themselves, and therefore to build resilience for harder times ahead. These are not hobbies for the rich, but means of empowering the whole community.

The supply systems which provide us with our daily produce may appear to be efficient and solid – but there again so did the banks before 2008! Planting seeds now for alternatives for the future makes sense and is our God-given duty.
