

A particular favourite sport of mine growing up was rugby. The reasons for this are multi-faceted, but a definite positive is that it was great fun smashing into other players. There was always great satisfaction tackling a kid who was bigger than you.

This week I read an article suggesting that we should ban tackles from school rugby. I was shocked: take tackling out of rugby and you cease to have the same sport. To me this epitomises our culture' desire to sanitise life. Would it not make more sense to train kids to tackle properly? This got me thinking about our culture in general – we have become, to put it mildly, quite risk averse. And there is a danger that this culture of risk aversion is infiltrating our portrayal of the message of Jesus.

At times when reading the gospels I find Jesus an uncomfortable character. I think having dinner with Jesus may well have been full of little glances across the table expressing the thought: "I can' believe he just said that!" Yet this highlights an important point – Jesus' message was full of challenge and contained quite a bit of risk.

In Luke 14:25-34 we find Jesus laying out his own version of a disclaimer form. He wants the disciples to know that following him will come with a cost: "whoever does not bear his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple" Jesus is asking the disciples – are you willing to take the risk?

I wonder, have we allowed some of our language around following Jesus to become akin to taking the tackling out of rugby? If we take away the cost, if we limit the risk, are we walking on the narrow path Jesus spoke about? Of course Jesus' message was not only about counting the cost. The reason we can take the risk and make that step of faith into the unknown is because of the security that Jesus brings. He promises to always be with us by his Spirit. He continually speaks of how our kind and loving Father in heaven will always provide for all our needs.

The unshakeable foundation of steadfast love revealed through Jesus' death and resurrection enabled the disciples to become bold and courageous in their witness to Jesus. Yet this still presents some challenging questions to us all: what risk is Jesus asking us to take? What area of our life has become completely sanitised? These days my involvement with rugby is full of risk aversion – I watch from a comfy sofa in a warm flat. The main danger is a pillow thrown at me from my wife when Scotland lose to England, aqain.

My prayer is that my life following Jesus would become less about risk aversion and more focused on loving and obedient trust.

TIVERTON STREET PASTORS

Bruce & Kathy Govett have been part of the Street Pastors' team in Tiverton since it was set up in March 2010. They live in Nomansland and are regular members of the Exe Valley Central congregation and our Mission Community Services. They also help



with the organisation of our monthly Prayer Breakfasts. We asked Bruce & Kathy about their experiences as Street Pastors.

What are Street pastors, and how did it start in Tiverton?

We are Christians from various denominations both in, and around Tiverton. We are happy to go out on the streets on Saturdays and other celebration nights, to be a Christian presence on the streets.

Do you have any training to become a Street Pastor?

Yes. As a new group we had to undertake 12 modules of training, including first aid, before we were commissioned. This took around a year. Now, new Pastors have to do 4 modules of training before they can come out with experienced Street Pastors. The balance of training has to be completed within a given period.

<u>Is it a clearly definite Christian activity?</u> Yes, it is definitely a Christian activity, however we do not discriminate against anybody who needs help on the grounds of colour, race or religion.

What are you trying to achieve - is it an evangelistic activity?

No, we do not go on the streets to evangelise. Although we carry a couple of small bibles in our rucksack, we never get them out unless anybody asks for one. Likewise, we never bring the subject of Christianity up unless someone wishes to talk to us first. We are showing the Lord's love on the streets through our presence.

How would you answer someone who might object along the lines "If young people want to act in such an irresponsible way, fuelled by alcohol

<u>late at night, why do you see it as your</u> responsibility to try to help them.

Everybody 'on the streets' is God's creation. We are out there doing God's work in order to keep them safe. We are His hands and feet on the streets. We are sure that most of us have acted irresponsibly at some time or other, therefore we are not out to judge.

I have heard that all Street Pastors do is give out flip flop sandals to girls who can hardly stand up for drink - is that a fair criticism?

No, it is correct that we do give out flip flops to girls who wear very stupid shoes, but this is only because they find it difficult to walk home in high heels. If they were to walk in bare feet and got cut by glass, it could result in a need for an ambulance to take them to R, D & E, as they would need an x-ray to make sure there was no glass left in the cut. This can take an ambulance out of the area for up to 4 hours.

As well as carrying flip flops in our rucksack, we carry a first aid kit, to help with minor injuries - and bottles of water as alcohol induces dehydration. The water also helps when people are nauseous from drink. We carry a dustpan and brush to clear up any broken glass we come across as this could be used as a weapon or cut bare feet. We always have a supply of lollipops to help diffuse tension. Additionally we have woolly hats and foil blankets and these have been used on several occasions. We carry a radio which is linked to the Police and door staff and we keep each up dated on issues as they occur.

<u>Tell us about the team - how many</u> street pastors are there in Tiverton and how often are you "on duty" There are 28 trained Street Pastors with 4 of them currently unavailable due to health issues. Generally, we do once every 4 – 6 weeks.

What do the prayer team do?

The Prayer Team are the important link between us on the streets and asking God for help as situations arise. On many occasions we have come across issues of fights etc, phoned the prayer team and after their prayers, the issue is diffused. We have had so many other situations where we have seen prayer work. For example, we found a girl who had lost her purse in She did not have any Remedies. means to get home and was very vulnerable and without support of friends. Our prayer team got to work and not only was her purse found but it had enough cash in it - to the penny to cover her taxi fare home.

What is your relationship with the police - do they approve of what you are doing?

First Class, initially officers were sceptical as they thought we might be a bible punching hindrance but over the years we have proved our worth on many occasions. The Police have often asked us to help people who are drunk, undertake minor first aid or just be a compassionate shoulder for someone to cry on. With my other hat on, a Police Chaplain, at the request of the Inspector in Honiton, I am actively trying to motivate the Churches to set up Street Pastors in their town.

I know that sometimes you are not in bed until 4.30am on a Sunday morning, and sometimes later, yet you are ready to help set up EVC in Templeton Village Hall by 10.30am the next day. How do you manage it?







With God's help, a good alarm clock, and an hour's sleep after Sunday lunch!!!!

What do you consider the most important part of your Street Pastor ministry?

To be a Christian Presence on the streets and to diminish the myth of Christians just being "bums on seats, on a Sunday".

NATURE NOTES

At this time of year our thoughts turn owards garden and home improvements or spring cleaning. We may be interrupted by Nature' visitors and have our 'live and let live' philosophy challenged.

I do love a bit of pruning, and gardening textbooks demand that hedges taper at the top to avoid possible damage if subjected to heavy snowfall. I was amazed to discover the number of last year' nests that I did not realise were there.

We regularly monitor our chimney and are careful to have fires at various intervals between March and Julv. Experience has taught us that apparently dormant chimneys are attractive to scouting bees and jackdaws. Curiously jackdaws seem somewhat impervious to fumes whilst bees, though slow to admit defeat, will not tolerate smoke. The ancient method of banging pots and pans was used to

encourage homeless swarms to settle on your land but conversely, the birds hate sudden and loud noises.

Our house martins came back last year and adopted an old nest, after I had made some minor repairs. They further reduced the size of the entrance, so much so that it was a miracle the adults were able to get in and out. Quite how they know the structure is strong enough to support a growing family is a mystery. Their elegant flight to and from the nest was very similar to other more permanent residents the bats that live in the roof space nearby. Predictably, at least two independent families of great tits will also disappear behind the fascias of the eaves, so any planned painting can be a halting effort.

I do hope the grey wagtails will be more sensible this year. Notoriously all wagtails leave a lot to be desired over their choice of location for their nests at ground level. Suffice it to say they chose to build at the side of the grid by our back door and I spent a worrying time ensuring the grid was kept clear, so that the discharge from the drainpipe did not wash away the nest and eggs and all.

If I am ever disappointed by my DIY attempts, I can always gain solace from observing the house-building of squirrels and buzzards. Their energy is enviable, but the kindest adjective describing their methods and results, is 'erratic'






