
A NEW BEGINNING!!

A New Dawn

probably the most difficult part of the process of appointing our new Rector, has been the necessity to keep things **'under** wraps' until announcement could be made; the fact that this had to be delayed for several reasons did not help matters! Also, with our new Rector being local, many had already put two and two together, so it came as little surprise to some, when the announcement was finally made on Sunday, 14 August. Nevertheless, the news that Rev. Steph Jeffs was to be our Rector and team leader was received with great enthusiasm and anticipation. Steph is already known to some through her former teaching role. Elizabeth and I have known Steph for some twenty-seven years, and we both believe that the waiting and frustrations of the past months will have been well worth it. From conversations with Steph since her appointment, we know that we are in for some exciting and, no doubt challenging, times; her forward thinking and planning (already into Advent 2017!) give reasons for confidence in our future. Steph will be instituted by Bishop Sarah at Cruwys Morchard on Wednesday 14 December, the Service beginning at 7.30pm.

A big 'thank you' to all who have been praying for a successful conclusion to the vacancy, but please now pray for Steph as she takes on this new role, and also for our Parishes as we prepare to really 'move on' in the ministry of our Mission Community.

Over the past months, Churchwardens' Council has been considering the necessity to employ an administrator on the basis of a set number of hours each week. When the vacancy was announced,

Elizabeth and I agreed to take this role back on (after less than twelve months of retirement!) to see the Mission Community through the vacancy. With the end of the vacancy now firmly in sight, we are both looking forward to retiring -The Mission Community is, again! therefore, looking to take on an administrator, though exactly what would be involved and where he or she would be based, is still the subject of discussion, but the probability is that somewhere between two and four mornings a week, of two-and-a-half hours each would be involved. We have had interest shown by one person but, if you think you might be interested, or know of someone else who might, then please do let me know. Elizabeth is willing to help in any way she can to ensure a smooth hand-over.

Our thanks to Templeton who hosted and co-ordinated the refreshments for "Tea. Cake and Conversation" with Bishop Sarah, on 21 August in Templeton Village Hall, being part of the "Bishops in Mission" weekend. Thanks also to the other Parishes for the donations of cakes.

Our Group Service in October will be at Stoodleigh at 10.30am on Sunday 23rd, with the November service at Templeton on Sunday 27th. There will not be a Group Service in December, as the fourth Sunday just happens to be Christmas Day!

NATURE NOTES

have just mown my wild-flower meadow for the first time. I realise this gardening fashion is over a decade old but it is not for the faint hearted. The best example I know is at the RHS Garden Hvde Hall. The wild flowers cascade in swathes down a hillside into which narrow paths, which cannot be seen at a distance, spread randomly through the planting like veins. Thus the clock is turned back a century and you walk through the meadow whilst dragging the obligatory hand through the wispy, waving sea.

My tangled and minuscule effort suffered because, not surprisingly in one season, few grasses had established in the plot. The books assure me that eventually they will try to dominate and advise Yellow Rattle should be introduced to weaken their growth. Other invaders showed no such reticence and Sow's Thistle, Bindweed and Creeping [should I say galloping?] Buttercup could not resist the carefully cleared ground. At least the insects pronounced the somewhat visually disappointing result a great success.

As usual, my sowing was heavy handed and I am sure I am not alone with a feeling of wonder and uncertainty every time I stand over open ground holding seeds that amount to little more than a handful of dust. I had wild-flower seed packets from many sources and, for once, particularly grateful to the supermarkets. They had greatly padded out their boxes of seeds with vermicullite, thus enabling easy observation of where the seeds were cast whilst supplying a comfortable feeling of being given a lot for your money.

I am totally charmed by some of the common names given to wild-flowers that will now grace my patch, particularly if they refer to the use to which they were once put. An example would be Lady's Bedstraw. Presumably the chambermaids of today struggle to find this online.



bring in prayers, space jokes and facts about space. We all learnt so much, not just the children. We got to know each "TODAY" 50 years ago other and make new friends during the week.



FROM THE ARCHIVES October/November 1966

ver the past few years I have accumulated a number of old issues of "Today" magazine, and now have an archive covering January 1966 to date more than fifty years! Thank you to those of you who have given me copies, but the following seven issues have, so far, proved elusive :-

February 1968; November 1971: November/December 1972; October/ November 1973: December 1973/ January 1974; June/July 1977; December 1998/January 1999.

If anybody has a copy of any of these hidden away somewhere, I would be pleased to hear from you.

The reason for all this is that I thought it might be interesting to look back at where we were in the Exe Valley on a 'Fifty years ago' basis. Please feedback what you think, but here goes with October and November, 1966.

The Exe Valley then comprised seven parishes Calverleigh, Morebath, Oakford, Rackenford, Stoodleigh, Washfield and Withleigh, under the leadership of Ron Herniman. Each church had at least one service on Sundays, two on some Sundays, but the Group was about to grow with the addition of Loxbeare and Templeton, and this would affect service times.

The magazine, then in A5 format, carried a section "Tots, Teens and Inbetweens", written by a certain Mr Wicawastrom – how many can remember the name, and what it signified?


