NATURE NOTES

During these extraordinary times it is hard not to yearn for a return to normality but we are warned to curb our impatience and control our expectations.

As we watch the changing seasons and the usual great uplift from sight of spring bulbs and lambs, the comfort provided from the start of nature's cycle has been very reassuring. Then again nothing is ever quite the same.

During the early decades of my life I had never even seen a peacock blue butterfly let alone the numbers I saw before April had begun.

The silly wood pigeons always nest at head height in a shrub not far from the washing line but they have decided not to provide frightening flaps this year [that make you drop the clothes' pegs]. Instead they are in the steep slop above the house in what could only be described as caves that have formed in the roots of undermined trees at the lip of the bank. It is said no-one ever sees baby pigeons – no wonder these are monsters!

Another sight has been the early arrival of bee flies. They only ever appear in the south of England but it must be a sign of global warming that they are now as common as they are in France. I particularly like their hovering flight and sword like proboscis that refreshes the parts other bees cannot reach. Not that they are wholly welcome as their larva are parasitoids

The slow worms have also shown early signs of life, if it can be called such, as the biting cold has not given them much energy. Their young curl up like baby eels in the shelter of fallen leaves, rocks and other debris and it is hard to tell if they welcome being uncovered in the watery sunlight. At least they know to keep off the lawn which has had two cuts before March was out – this is a record, so times are indeed a' changing.

At last, the news we have been waiting for, official confirmation that non-essential shops can open again next Monday, 12th April. We can also reopen the second-hand book section and make the toilet available. We will also ask you to use the hand-sanitizer before touching any stock.

Unfortunately, we cannot reopen the café yet, that will have to wait a few more weeks and when we do reopen it, we are not sure exactly what restrictions might still apply.

Hopefully, it will not be too long before we can get back to normal, or as near as we can get in the circumstances.

Some more good news - we are in the process of obtaining quotations to pave the back garden to make it suitable for additional outside seating for use by our café customers. We hope this might be ready sometime during the summer.

Can you please pass all this information on to others in your fellowship, thank you.


In the meantime, thank you for your support and prayers. Thankfully, due to the generosity of our supporters and some government grants, we have been able to weather the storm, praise the Lord.

t is with great sympathy for Her Maiesty the Queen, upon the death of her husband of 70 years, from us all, as we remember Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh and what he has done for us all.

Spring is nearly gone, Summer nearly here, and our Church is still locked as I write.

Easter was wonderful though, the Church was opened for the traditional Easter Communion Service at 8 am (with a little difference) we SANG the first hymn OUTSIDE, "Thine be the glory" Then we all went inside for the said Service of Communion, to finish the service we SANG outside again, "How great thou art" with the sun shinning and the sound of the organ being played by Jennifer, from inside. It was a lovely way to begin EASTER DAY.

On Good Friday many of us went to Templeton Church at 2pm for the last hour's service of Music, Readings and Reflections. It was a very moving hour.

LADY DAY

"Do you know the White Cliffs of Dover?" I once heard somebody ask at a crowded cocktail party in London. "Oh, yes", came the reply, "We were having dinner with them only last night". Which reminded me of a remark made by the late lamented Victor Borge when referring to the concert hall in Kensington where he was performing as "coming to us by kind permission of Mr. and Mrs. Albert Hall".

But there is one title with which you fool around at your peril, and that is that of Lady Day. If the name sounds at all familiar it is probably because you were brought up in the Proper Faith and recognise the common name for the Feast of the Annunciation, which marks the moment when traditionally the Angel Gabriel informed the Virgin Mary that she was going to have a baby. It was the kind of news which must have come like a bolt from the blue for her, particularly when you consider her status, but there was not a lot she could do about it, and nine months later to the day she gave birth to a baby boy whom we have come to know and love as Jesus.

These two milestone events, Lady Day and Christmas, have come to be known as "Quarter Days", and they have two running mates in the form of Midsummer and Michaelmas, giving us 25th March (Lady Day), 24th June (Midsummer), 29th (Michaelmas) and 25th September December (Christmas), which last named is the easiest one to remember of the lot, and incidentally the date on which my late mother long ago fixed for renewing all her insurances. Curiously enough, she chose to die in the middle of December, which meant that we buried her on Christmas Eve, a date that is now burned into the memory of the

The future is bright

opefully, we are now on the Road Map to fewer restrictions, more travel, and warmer weather – the future looks brighter!! But, given the events of the past year, we shall remain cautiously optimistic about future planning.

Church services are gradually returning to the parishes.

The Easter Services at St Margaret's Church, Templeton included a Group Good Friday Meditation Service and a lay-led Easter Sunday Service. These services have remained distanced and masked, with no singing of hymns, even though we have so enjoyed listening to the music being played on the organ by Martin Strong. We look forward to singing the hymns with Martin before too long.

Templeton's Annual Parochial Church Meeting was held on the 24 March, via Zoom, where innovative suggestions to move forward with the Church were discussed. The PCC thanked Steph for ensuring that the regular weekly events, such as coffee mornings, Bible study and Sunday Services, have continued through the year with the use of zoom and conference calls, while St Margaret's Church has been closed and services limited. Reg Coffin and William Withers have agreed to continue as Churchwardens. Lynda also agreed to continue as Safeguarding Officer. Many thanks to them for the time-consuming work they do for our parish. Even though the churches are gradually reopening their doors, zoom and conference call services will continue.

Future Services at St Margaret's Church

It is likely that there will be two lay-led church services each month, and one group communion service at one of the nine parishes within the Exe Valley each week. If you would like to know more about the services at Templeton, please phone William (251513) or Reg (860246).

Maintenance of the Church

While St Margaret's Church was closed temporarily there were no church services in Templeton and therefore no income from collections, but the expenses continued as usual. We need to raise, on average, \$5,000 each year to cover insurance, heating, and ongoing repairs etc.

St Margaret's Church is our focal point within Templeton Village and, as well as church services, is regularly used for book club meetings, coffee mornings and 'Knit and Natter' – or was before Covid-19 affected our lives. Our church is a beautiful historic building with a long history. The original Church of St Margaret, built in 1335, formerly belonged to the Knights Templars, and the present church was rebuilt in the same style in 1886. If you would like to know more about its history there is a booklet available at £3 a copy - please contact William or Reg.

The Churchvard Extension

And, to everyone, once again, stay safe and take care.







I stepped through the gateway onto the grass and felt the soft earth beneath my feet. Each blade of grass was blessed with a sparkling diamond where Mother Nature had scattered a billion dewdrops. As I trod the sheep path across the field, I suddenly realised what it meant to have farming blood in my veins. This is what my father missed. Feeling one with the earth, aware of buds awakening on oak and ash, hearing water running over stones in the ditch, individual bird song, lambs bleating, noticing the colours and scents changing with the seasons and the sense of meadows and trees enveloping him, keeping him in their world.

Dementia had robbed him of his lifetime's work, had uprooted him and dropped him in a bewildering, strange place where his skills and knowledge were unrecognised and he felt useless.

How glad we were to bring him to Devon where he was surrounded by fields, farms and farming folk who were happy to talk of sheep prices, cattle, market and memories of their fathers' shire horses, threshing machines, homemade cider and little grey Fergies.

Caring for someone with dementia is not easy, but help was at hand. Devon Carers were able to advise and support, providing information about dementia, signposting to support groups, events and availability of equipment. Their training courses ranged from Mindfulness, Stress Management, First Aid, and Resilient Relationships to many others.

Devon Carers support unpaid carers; not just those caring for someone with dementia, but anyone caring for someone who is frail, disabled, ill, struggling with a mental health problem or an addiction.
