



#### **NATURE NOTES**

It is fair to record that the Winter has been kind to Devon even if there is something to come.

Perhaps there is something to be said for mud and the colour grey. This is perhaps a little unfair as the fields in the South have gamely tried to stay green and there is one oak tree in Knightshayes that has refused to admit to being deciduous.

As befits the time it appears that Nature has retired from view, and like us is waiting for blue skies when we can spark into life and enjoy it. On the bright days it has appeared that most birds share this impatience to get out, and the grey wagtails in particular wander over rooftops with every sign of suppressed energy.

Irrespective of the day, a walk along the Grand Western Canal will always be met with signs of activity and long views of the countryside bleakly at rest. I cannot promise the flash of a kingfisher, but I can assure you it happens.

The BBC are to be hugely admired for satisfying those who wish to study Nature from the comfort of their armchair. It seems self-evident to me they have attracted the best talents in the World in terms of camerawork and those wholly dedicated to Nature. I have particularly enjoyed Winter Watch and similar seasonal offerings.

I am very conscious of the movement of animals overnight – the cry of the owl, the fresh trails of mammals the day after – but who would have thought that the hours of Winter darkness are filled with the crowd that the special cameras reveal?

Equally delightful was the cameraman in Devon who reproduced the growth of a giant water lily, a native of Peru, in his shed so that we could see its whole lifecycle.

I do not need to mention David Attenborough and long may the BBC continue – if it ain't broke don't fix it.

#### To raise awareness

Himalayan Balsam (Impatiens glanulifera) goes by many names: Policeman's Helmet, Indian Balsam, Jumping Jacks, Stinky Pops and Poor Man's Orchid, and it does indeed resemble an orchid.

I recall when I first saw great swathes of it bordering the lanes as I drove from Tiverton to Dulverton, I marvelled at is beauty, its towering pink flowers bobbing in the breeze, almost mesmerising. But, as with many things of mesmerising beauty, it has a sinister side to its presence!

Believed to have been introduced to Kew Gardens from Kashmir in 1839, its explosive seed pods, often reaching more than 7 metres (22 feet) away, quickly spread across the UK. Travelling along rivers and carried by unsuspecting humans and animals it has taken hold and now dominates huge areas, achieving the status of one of Europe's most invasive plants. And it is here and spreading apace in our beautiful county.

But isn't it a great pollinator? What's so bad about it?

A quick check with Uncle Google will throw up enough information and reasons as to why this NNIS (nonnative invasive species) is such a threat to the health of our habitats, wildlife, and land.

To summarise:

It is now our largest annual plant, often reaching between 6-10 feet (1.8m-3m). Its seeds explode up to 7 metres, meaning it spreads fast and colonises new areas quickly.


It competes with our native plants for light, nutrients, pollinators, and space. Killing off vital wildflowers for our insects. It has also been found to deplete the mycorrhizal layer of soil fungi, preventing regrowth of native plants.

In the winter it dies back, exposing banks and leaving them vulnerable to erosion. Without vegetation to stabilise the banks, we lose the banks entirely. We lose the wildlife living within the banks, such as water voles and kingfishers. Flooding is more frequent. A major concern for anyone with a riverside home or grazing for animals.

With the erosion of banks our waterways become heavier with silt. This reduces the water quality and smothers aquatic life, including fish spawning grounds. Our waterways will become devoid of life.

And for anyone who gets out and enjoys our beautiful landscape and far

reaching views, our enjoyment is now obliterated by towering pink flowers.

costs for tackling this environmental issue run into the millions. Millions of pounds that councils and authorities just don't have.

So what can we do?

Being aware is a great first step. And timing is the next. It is all in the timing of how we can make a difference.

Between May, June and July, critically BEFORE the seed's heads are ripe and ready to explode, is the time to pull this plant up by the roots. And it is an easy plant to pull up!

But it takes many hands to help. It could be small volunteer groups, it could be larger community efforts, individuals tackling the lanes in which they live or a larger movement involving wildlife trusts and river agencies.

Success has been seen across the Torridge River Restoration Project and the Otter Valley Association, so it can

No matter if a regular church goer or not. The impressive building, its glebe garden and graveyard, centrally positioned in the village, enhance the environment but require upkeep and care.




Our Plough Sunday Service was very well attended and, again, our thanks to all who took part in the service.
