WHAT'S ON

NATURE NOTES

January or February evening, grab a flask, wrap up warm and try stepping out into the garden for twenty minutes.

There is every chance that you will hear the night air reverberate to the eerie "too-whit-too-woo" of our most common owl, the tawny owl. The classic "too-whit-too-woo" is in fact made up of the "too-whit" of the female and "two-woo" of the male. In reality, "ke-wick" and "whoo who-who-who-whoooo" are nearer the mark.

"Tawnies" are early nesters making this the perfect time of year to eavesdrop on them as they reaffirm their pair bonds prior to breeding. From as early as mid-February, the female will lay a clutch of two to four white eggs in a hollow tree, old crow's nest or specially designed nest box, if on offer.

Whilst most bird eggs are well camouflaged, it is the thought that by producing pale-coloured eggs, nocturnal birds find it easier to see and avoid damaging them as they drop into the dark confines of the nest site.

Another "early bird" is the grey heron. Like the "tawnies", they will often be sat on eggs by late February or early March. However, unlike a tawny owl's nest, those of the heron are large and rather dishevelled structures often built in the very tops of some of our tallest trees. Here, they (and their occupants) must be able to withstand the very worst of the winter gales. As a rule, multiple nests are found in the same tree or group of trees in what is termed a "heronry".

In the breeding season, any heron flying over or fishing locally, will probably be travelling back and forth to our local heronry on the lower reaches of the Dart Valley, not far from Bickleigh. If you are lucky, you may catch sight of a commuting heron with its unmistakable large silhouette, tucked in head and lumbering flight, or be notified of its presence by a loud, piercing squawk as it flies over.

On Valentine's Day, the cacophony of croaking emanating from a local pond announces that it's not only Homo sapiens that might be feeling a little amorous. Toads are unlikely to breed until March but their smaller, smooth-skinned cousins, given warm and damp conditions, will often start spawning in early February. With milder winters, it is now commonplace to see frogspawn in mid, or even early, January. Sadly, many frogs will fail to breed as the local otters, herons and tawny owls help themselves to the bountiful supply of food on offer.

With so many ponds having disappeared from the wider countryside, we can all do our bit to help our amphibians by installing a pond. The bigger the better. However, even a washing up bowl sized mini pond sunk into a sunny and wild corner of the garden has every chance of attracting newts and a spawning frog or

Whilst it's no match for a dawn chorus, even in January and February some of our wildlife is stirring and beginning to advertise its presence. How about taking a listen?




