Did you know?

There were lots of influences on people's faith in Colossae. The original inhabitants worshipped as part of various secret cults. Then, as Greeks and then Romans inhabited the area, they brought their religions with them. So, there were many different choices for worshippers in Colossae. The Roman author, Cicero, tells us that there was also a 10,000-strong Jewish community in the city.

You are one of the people of Colossae. You have been attending the church there for some time now and have learnt much from the teachings you have heard there. One key area of teaching is that you should only worship the one true God, who you can access only through Christ's death on the cross. But one of your friends, who follows your old religion, has invited you
