## Did you know?

The writer of this 'letter' was probably not Paul, the writing style is quite different. We know that the writer knew about Jewish teaching and Greek philosophy. And that they loved Jesus and wanted others to follow him. Lots of stories from the Hebrew Jewish scriptures (the Old Testament in the Bible) are included, so that's why it was later called the letter to the Hebrews.

We think it was written for a group of Jewish Christians in around AD 60-70, when Christians in the Greek/Roman Empire were suffering because of their faith, under Emperors like Nero.
