
Baptism and Confirmation

NATURE NOTES

Who's That Singing Their Heart Out?

ne of the many delights offered up Uby the natural world is the symphony of song that fills our gardens and churchyards as the birds busy themselves with establishing their territories and attracting a mate. For many of us, simply listening to the rich orchestra of coos, chirps, cascades, trills and warbles on a sun-drenched spring day is reward enough. However, tunina into and identifvina the individuals can elevate the experience to another level. There is no better place and time to start deciphering bird gardens than our sona and churchyards in April and May. At first, it may seem a daunting task to fathom out who is saying what, but there's help on offer.

An excellent way to make this deeper connection with nature and your surroundings is to simply stop and listen. Having taken in the whole, try focusing in on the individual songs before attempting to identify who it is that's making their presence known. With luck and patience, you will have made the connection between the singer and their song. Then, with experience and practice, a bird singing its heart out but hidden from prving eves can often be identified from its song alone. Admittedly, if you are anything like me, come the following spring, a little 'revision' may be required!

Another tip is to memorize the mnemonics associated with certain birds. The great tit is a case in point as it broadcasts its aptly described twosyllable trademark song, delivered on

repeat: 'teacher-teacher teacherteacher teacher-teacher'

Often heard clattering from its nest, wood pigeons too have a mnemonic for their monotonous, cooing song. Whilst the great tit's mnemonic is a nearperfect rendition, that of a wood pigeon requires a little more interpretation: "two cows Teddy, take two cows Teddy, take two cows Teddy, take." They really do sound as if they are finishing midsentence. Distinguishing a wood pigeon from the similar-sounding but smaller and less flamboyant collared dove is made a little easier when you know the chant of the collared dove: 'un-it-ed, un-it-ed, un-it-ed' (are all collared doves football supporters !?).

Despite not being entirely accurate, my favourite mnemonic has to be that of a bird not of our gardens but of the open countryside. Perched on a weathered fence post or a swaying telephone wire, you may be fortunate to happen across vellowhammer broadcasting а а melodic request for "a little bit of bread and no cheeeeese". Having made guite an impression on me, I can still picture the scene when, 50 or so years ago, I stood transfixed and enchanted by my first ever sighting of one of these lemon yellow and brown-streaked buntings in full song.

Occasionally appearing in our gardens, one bird 'says it on the tin', taking its name directly from its song: "chiffchaff chiffchaff chiffchaff." However, a word of caution. The two syllables of the chiffchaff could easily be confused with those of the "teacher-teacher" of a great tit.

Sadly, not as common as it once was, the song thrush lives up to its name as it screams out its repetitive, yet varied song, from a high perch. The song has, with good reason, been compared to punk rock – very loud and very repetitive! Several short phrases are repeated before moving onto another series, as if attempting to improve on the previous version.

Then there's the wren, very common and widespread it is one of our smallest birds but one that packs a huge punch for its size as it blasts out its unmistakable high-pitched and machine-gun-like trill from a low tree or shrub.

Mention must be made of one of our most melodious of garden birds, the male blackbird. Easy to both see and identify as it sings from atop a tall tree, TV aerial or chimney pot, our spring gardens are often bathed with his prolific, varied and glorious repertoire: "A mindless old bloke down the bottom of the garden just whistling" I suggest it doesn't do justice to it.

If you are struggling to get your head (and ears) around bird song, for those with the internet, I recommend using the RSPB website where it has the option to both identify and listen to most bird species. However, for those of you with a smartphone and keen to learn more, the Merlin app is a must.
